



School Board Report  
January 28, 2019

- Mr. Newkirk has looked through transcripts of all students hoping to graduate, this year. Currently, 92 fourth-year students are on track, while 4 others are hoping to recover credits through Grad Point. That would bring our estimated graduating class anywhere between 92 – 96 students.
- We are winding down with the formal evaluation process, which is going well.
- We are gathering data and input to see if adding an enrichment/advisory period to our daily schedule would be of benefit to our students.
- We had dual-credit sign up last week. We have approximately 181 students getting college credit for classes offered at MCHS.
- IHSA Amendment 23 passed which means we will start playing Illinois opponents in football, opposed to Big 8 member schools, starting in 2021. I would ask the Board's blessing to leave the Big 8 conference altogether once the new football scheduling is implemented. From there, we would look to join an Illinois conference. We have begun informal conversations on what other schools may plan to do when the potential conference shuffling takes place. If joining an area Illinois conference does not materialize, I would recommend we become an independent in other sports and activities.
- Our math department went to an ROE training in hopes of improving our math curriculum and strategies.
- Our guidance department has begun the scheduling process for next year's classes.
