- *Spring fundraiser chocolates were given to students for delivery. We had good fundraising totals again selling World's Finest Chocolates.

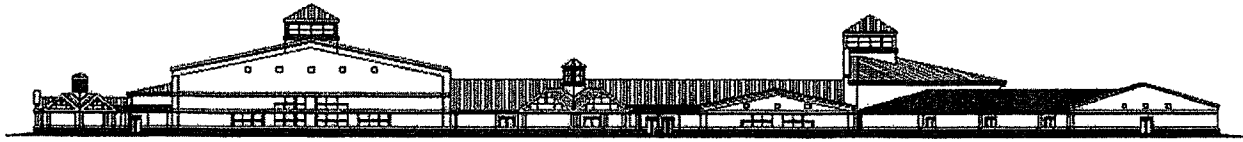

PARCC Test

MCMS has been spending considerable time preparing for the upcoming PARCC test, which will be from April 13th-21st. We will be testing in a little different format this year with only one test per day from about 8-10 AM. While this is only one test, we use this test in a multitude of ways to help improve instruction for our students.

School Improvement

The staff members in the district have been participating in a yearlong Peer Study where grade level or subject area groups have been studying a particular educational initiative. The Peer Studies will be concluding with the groups presenting to the rest of the district staff on April 27th and 28th.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Parent/Teacher Conferences were held on April 6th and 7th. This year, all of our 6th, 7th, and 8th grade teachers held student led conferences. If parents were unable to attend either day, they are able to schedule an alternate conference with the grade level team. In addition, teachers also sent home the student led conference forms if parents were unable to attend. In total, 86 conferences were held, which is a significant increase from last year at this time.

Our music department has been working very hard to prepare for our annual spring concert on Tuesday, May 9th. The concert will feature our 5th – 8th grade bands as well as our 6th – 8th grade chorus groups. Feel free to attend to hear some great musical performances.

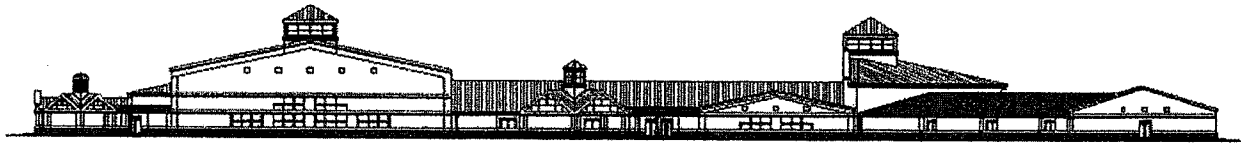
Staff Appreciation Week

- **Important dates- Honor's Night May 18 at 7 p.m., Graduation May 19 at 8 p.m.**, the student's last day May 25.
- Student requests are finalized; Mrs. Paddick and I have finalized the needs for the Master Schedule; and the students are being loaded to populate the classes within the Master Schedule. The Guidance Department will then need to talk with students about course changes to student's schedules. We hope to have student schedules and faculty assignments complete by April 20.

Board Report

Curriculum and Assessment

I am currently working to develop a curriculum and assessment plan for next year. We will be changing some aspects of our assessment and progress monitoring to enhance our multi-tiered system of support (MTSS). These changes will include looking at how we utilize Accelerated Reader, Accelerated Math and the Renaissance products. We are looking at updating some of our curriculum products into a more device-oriented platform. Some of our teachers have been previewing these on-line materials that we may consider for next year. All curriculum changes will be reported in May.

Professional Development

Peer Study Team presentations will be given beginning on April 27th during the School Improvement early out and conclude during the Teacher Institute on April 28th.

Teachers will also be completing a Needs Assessment Survey that will help guide curriculum and professional development for next year. Survey results will be reported to the Board in next month's report.

Our business and computer teachers visited Marion school district to observe their classes and compare curriculum. They are planning on at least one more school visit before the end of the year. We want to insure that our business and computer curriculums are up to par with surrounding district. These visits are very beneficial to our teachers.

Funding

I have been working with Kevin and Carla to determine our technology needs for the FY18 school year. Two local sources have supported our technology initiative in the past several years and I have written funding request to them. We are seeking funds to support the management modules for our Chromebooks. We are also working to secure the purchase of smart boards for several classrooms.

School Registration

School registration dates have been set for FY18. The K-6 registration will be held on August 7th. Mt. Carmel Junior High will be August 8th and MCHS will be August 10th. Parents registering will be asked to log in to the Lumen parent portal to complete the required forms prior to registration. More details will be made available to parents by the end of this school year.

Pre-School for All

The district's pre-k program applied for and was granted an additional \$4,818 for this fiscal year. These additional funds will provide a covered shelter for outdoor play, building repairs and additional supplies needed for pre-k instruction.

A revised plan for the Early Childhood Block Grant (ECBG) funding for FY 18 is also being put in place to allow stability for currently funded grantees while also allowing for program expansion opportunities. Due to delays in the release of the Requests for Proposals, the full re-competition of the ECBG is being delayed until FY 19. Currently funded Preschool for All (PFA), Preschool for All Expansion (PFAE), and Prevention Initiative (PI) grantees will receive continuation funding for FY 18 and will complete continuation applications.
