Student Expulsions

President Schuler recommended that Student (BT) be expelled for violating Section III of the rules of the District governing student conduct as found in the Student Handbook of the District. Student (BT) will be expelled for not more than (2) calendar years. The District has the option to review his status at the end of the 2018-2019 school year to see if he can return to MCHS for the 2019-2020 school year. It is recommended Student (BT) be transferred to the Learning Alternative Branch (LAB) School or the Alternative School in Norris City, Illinois. A motion to approve the recommendation was made by Hocking and seconded by Peach. A roll call vote was taken. All present voted Aye. **Motion Carried.** Earnest was absent.

President Schuler recommended the Student (BU) be expelled for violating Section III of the rules of the District governing student conduct as found in the Student Handbook of the District. Student (BU) will be expelled for not more than (2) calendar years. It is recommended that Student (BU) be provided with access to classes that will allow him to graduate. New Business

Consider Contract for Internet and Phone Service

Kevin Smith recommended a five (5) year contract with Clear Wave beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. The total cost of the contract is \$87,420 annually; however, the District's Erate discount lowers the amount to \$25,980 annually. He noted there would be a savings of \$5,052.00 compared to the District's current contract. A motion to approve the contract as presented was made by Peach and seconded by Janice Alka. A roll call vote was taken. All present voted Aye. **Motion Carried.** Earnest was absent.

Discuss Pay to Play and Transportation for Sporting/Band Events

Superintendent Buss reported that the cost to the parents and students had become a financial burden. He also said that coaches sometimes had difficulty finding parents to drive the athletes to their sporting events. He asked if Pay to Play could be eliminated or reduced and if the District could take over the transportation costs for extra-curricular activities. The Board asked for more data regarding the transportation costs to the District as well as costs to have extra-curricular activities.

School Improvement

Science Fair @ Carbondale

Several MCJHS 8th grade students competed in the IJAS Science Fair at SIU Carbondale on March 6th. All groups participating received the highest ranking or Gold award from the judges. Unfortunately, we did not have anyone qualify for the State competition, but there were some monetary award winners, Elizabeth Kaisinger and Ashlyn Peach won \$50.00 from the Office of Associate Chancellor of Institutional Diversity. Ivan Holt won \$100 for overall excellence from the School of Medicine. 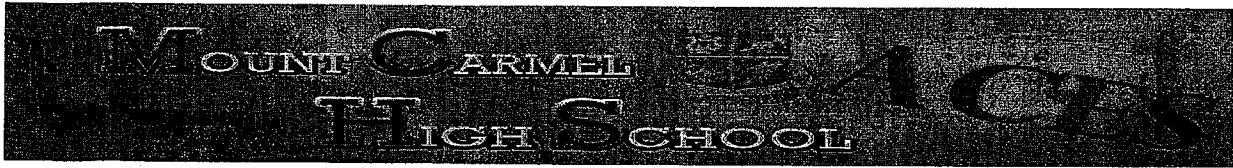
Extra & Co-curricular

ESSA Grants

We have been notified by the ISBE that we are receiving an additional \$34,000 in Title I funding. I am currently working on submitting an amendment to budget this additional money. A portion of this money will be used to provide needed technology.

Competitive Grants

I am applying for a grant to the Illinois Department of Transportation that would help fund underage drinking and driving prevention programs. This grant could potentially help fund Erin Peach to do some of this work for the district and support her presence in our schools.

Early Childhood ISBE Monitoring Visit

The 0-3 Prevention Initiative has received notice that our program will receive an ISBE monitoring visit sometime in April. This program has not been monitored in many years. We are working diligently to make sure that we have all documentation in place in order to satisfy the criteria set forth by ISBE. Results of the monitoring visit will be shared in a future board report.

Professional Development

The next school improvement day is scheduled for March 22. Teachers will be working on their Peer Study Projects which will be presented during the last Teacher Institute in April.

Active Shooter Drills

Mt. Carmel Elementary School participated in an active shooter drill on February 16th. Mt. Carmel Grade Schools drill is scheduled for March 22nd and the junior high and high school will have a drill on April 27th.

School Schedules and Curriculum

I have been talking with building principals about curriculum needs for next year and how scheduling can affect what we teach. Mr. Buss and I will be meeting with Mr. Holt and Mr. Newkirk sometime within the next few weeks to insure that next year's schedules will allow for sufficient time for core curriculum classes. We will look at suggestions from our consultant, Elliot Merenbloom and make final decisions for next year as soon as possible.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

MARCH 19, 2018

DISTRICT HEALTH SCREENING

Our health screening is scheduled for April 27th at Wabash General Hospital. Wabash General will again perform the tests. These tests include: Height, Weight, Blood Pressure & Pulse, BMI Labs -Lipid Panel (total Cholesterol, HDL, LDL, Triglycerides & Risk Ratio), Blood Glucose, Complete Blood Count (CBC), Wellness Profile, Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA), and Bone Density.

PARCC TESTING

Our students preparing to take the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) Test. Students in grades 3-8 will be again tested in English/Language Arts and Math. Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) will also be given to grades 5 & 8 with all MCHS Biology students taking the high school version. MCHS Juniors will also be taking the SAT this year rather than the ACT used in previous years. Most tests will be given on the computer so we are testing our technology. Test results will be returned to District #348 sometime this summer.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

I am hearing that ISBE is close to notifying school districts of how the new State Funding Formula (Evidence Based Model/Evidence Based Funding-EBM/EBF) will work and how much more/less each district will receive. District #348 is expecting an increase.

FACILITIES UPDATE

We have been battling a few leaks in the Junior High and have our roofing company that we have an extended warranty with looking into the leaks and will do the repairs. I will be putting together a list of maintenance projects for the upcoming summer. We have a lot to do. I will also be scheduling a Building and Grounds Committee meeting in the near future.

With us having to use 4 days for inclement weather this winter, the last day of school if no more days are used will be Thursday, May 31st. That will be the last day for students and teachers.
