These meetings actually take place several afternoons, as well as my teachers started at 3:30 p.m. on the Tuesday & Thursday. Total parent contact was 88% if you include recent IEP meetings and phone conferences. The teachers made contact with the parents to try to get all parents signed up for a conference.
