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## **School Board Report** **April 18, 2016**

### **PARCC Test**

MCMS has been spending considerable time preparing for the upcoming PARCC test, which will be from May 3<sup>rd</sup> to May 6<sup>th</sup>. This will be the first time that all 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students will be all taking it during the same week, so we are making sure our network can handle it. With PARCC, there are going to be technological issues regardless of what we do as a school, but we want to minimize these as much as possible. We have been told that we will receive the results as early as next fall.

### **School Improvement**

MCMS staff will be participating in school improvement efforts on April 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Educational Consultant, Deb Greaney, will spend the morning of the 28<sup>th</sup> visiting each of the classrooms and will meet with the teachers in the afternoon to see what can be improved. Staff will also provide our own "Educamp" where there will be many topics presented where teachers can go where they need most. On the 29<sup>th</sup>, district staff members will spend most of the day in vertical articulation making sure their curriculum is aligned for the coming year.

### **Spring Concert**

Our music department has been working very hard to prepare for our annual spring concert on Tuesday, May 10<sup>th</sup>. The concert will feature our 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade bands as well as our 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade chorus groups. - Student requests are finalized; Mrs. Paddick and I have finalized the needs for the Master Schedule; and the students are being loaded to populate the classes within the Master Schedule. **Project Lead the Way**

Since the visit from Project Lead the Way's, Sena Cooper, Mr. Holt, Mr. Newkirk and I have been in discussion with the Mt. Carmel Middle School science teachers about offering PLTW courses through our science curriculum. We will be offering three PLTW courses next year as part of the current curriculum. Mrs. Kieffer will be teaching, **Science of Technology**, Mrs. Yancey will be teaching , **Energy and the Environment** and Mrs. Dougherty will be teaching, **Medical Detectives**. These courses are approximately nine weeks long and feature project-based curriculums designed to challenge and engage the natural curiosity and imagination of middle school students. They are the natural precursor to our high school PLTW programs and will move our science curriculum forward in meeting the Next Generation Science Standards.

**Professional Development**

April 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> will be our last professional development workshops for the year. Shannon Henson from ROE #20 will be in the district to work with teachers on license renewal. We will also be hosting a Youth Mental Health First Aid class. Teacher teams and departments will be working together to define curriculum needs for next year, align curriculum and discuss hot topics surrounding course disciplines.

I will be attending ISBE's Title Grants and Federal/State Monitoring technical assistance workshop in Effingham on May 12<sup>th</sup>. As in years past, this workshop will offer updates on what's new in the FY17 Consolidated Application, and review the federal OmniCircular and its impact on auditing and monitoring. The afternoon session will focus on the Every Student Succeeds Act.

**Curriculum Materials**

I am in the process of updating information for our reading and math site license agreements and reviewing curriculum for next year. We will begin receiving curriculum materials requisitions following our April 29<sup>th</sup> Teacher Institute and ordering for next year will begin later in May.

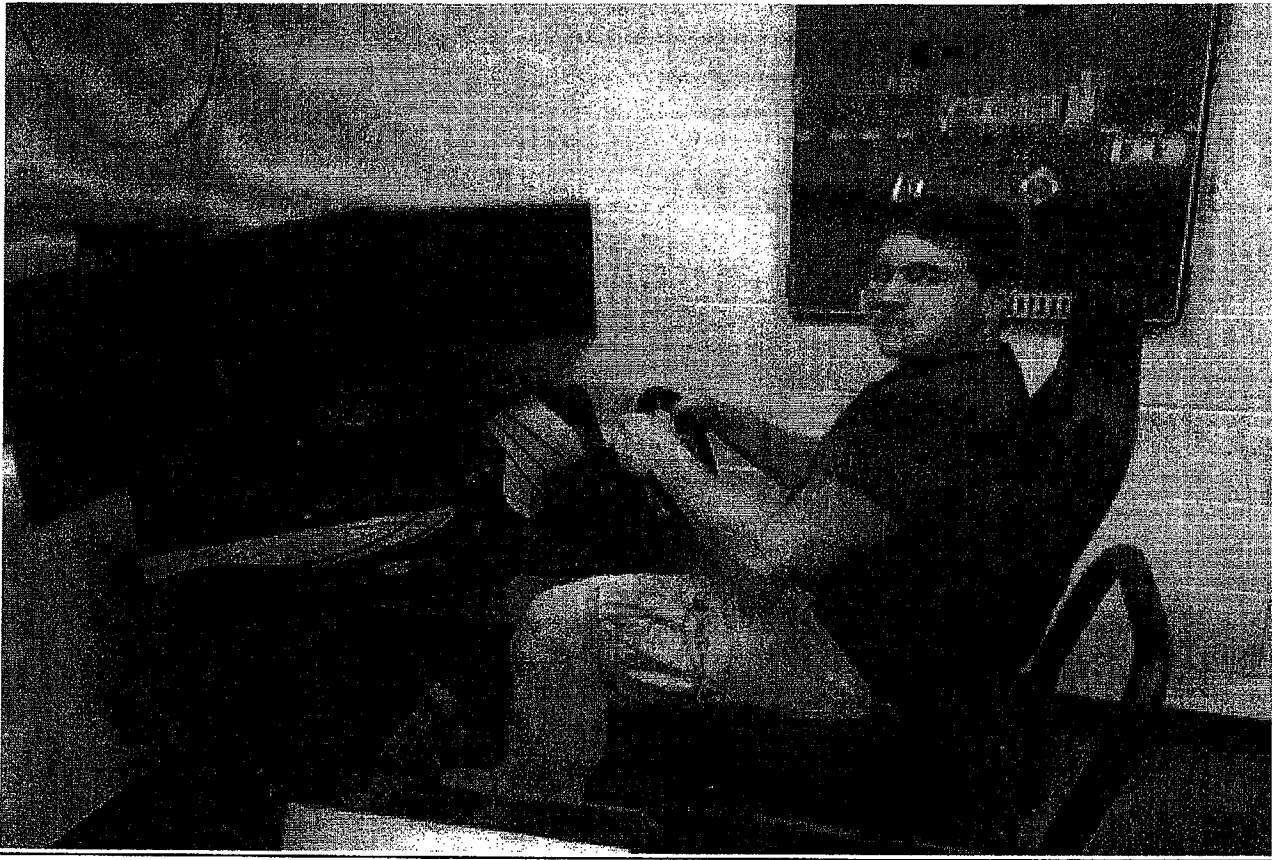
**ISBE Report Status**
